### **Pupil Premium 2015-2016**

#### **What is the Pupil Premium Grant?**

The Pupil Premium Grant is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England; it is designed to help schools raise the attainment of disadvantaged children and close the gap between them and their peers.

#### **Who should benefit from the Pupil Premium Grant?**

- Children who are entitled to Free School Meals
- Children who have been entitled to Free School Meals during the last six years (this category is referred to as the 'Ever 6')
- Children who are 'looked after'
- Children who are adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 and who have left care under a Special Guardianship or Residence Order
- Have parents in the regular armed forces, or who have been in the armed forces in the last four years

#### **How much will we receive?**

For the 2015-2016 academic year Beecroft Academy will receive £1,320 for every eligible pupil (FSM and Ever 6) and £1,900 for every child looked after by the local authority. This will equate to a total of £148,000.

#### **How will our Pupil Premium Grant be spent?**

We anticipate spending our Pupil Premium grant on the following:

Phonics intervention	1:1 or 1:2 interventions for children who need support in passing their phonics screening.	£7,547

Play therapy and nurture group	Where it is seen appropriate, some children will be offered support through activities that focus on their social, emotional and behavioural development.	£13,244
Specialist intervention teacher	Qualified teacher employed for 2 days a week to provide 1:1 or small group tutoring to 'plug gaps in learning'.	£16,027
Reading recovery teacher	Trained member of staff to complete daily one-to-one reading with identified children.	£13,727



Forest school	Trained teacher to complete 1 10 week cycle of the Forest School Programme.	£6,183
Music lessons	Music lessons in guitar, violins and drums provided for children.	£14,873
Staff training	Staff training will ensure that children entitled to Pupil Premium receive provision that suits their needs.	TBC
Extra-curricular clubs	Staff employed for additional hours to run after school clubs. All children entitled to Pupil Premium will have the opportunity to attend these clubs.	£6,149
Sports interventions	Specialist Sports Teacher to deliver team building and self-confidence sessions to children who are eligible for pupil premium funding. This will work alongside the Sports Premium funding.	£3,092
