LITERACY: WRITING WORDS

In literacy this half-term we have been thinking about our writing and how we can use our phonics knowledge in our literacy lessons.

The children have learnt over 30 new sounds now and we are starting to try and apply our phonic knowledge when the children want to write words, labels or captions. We have been practising reading and writing our harder to read and spell words in our lessons.

We are immensely proud of the children and how they are applying all the phonics sounds we have been teaching them recently.



MATHS

Over the last couple of weeks we have been consolidating our learning about numbers to 5. The children have been learning to subitise, write their numerals correctly, order their numbers and understand one more or one less than a given number. The children have enjoyed learning these objectives through a range of activities.
