Dear Parents and Carers

With the spring term now in full swing, we have enjoyed various stand out moments. Pupils in Year 2, 4 and 6 have attended first aid workshops. The important skills learnt in these workshops could one day save a life.

We have also been visited by a fire engine enabling children to learn about fire safety. Year 4 have continued to visit Rebecca Adlington's swimming sessions and I have enjoyed afternoon tea with values winners in the dining hall. I enjoy afternoon tea every month and it is an absolute delight. The children always display excellent manners and the Beecroft values and it is as much a reward for me as it is for them!

We are working closely as a school with SNAP Parent Carer Forum (PCF). 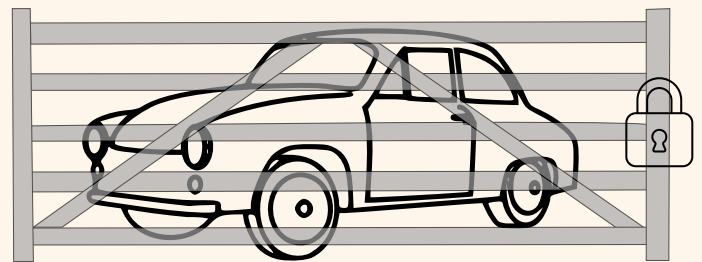
