Label all school uniform, including PE kit.

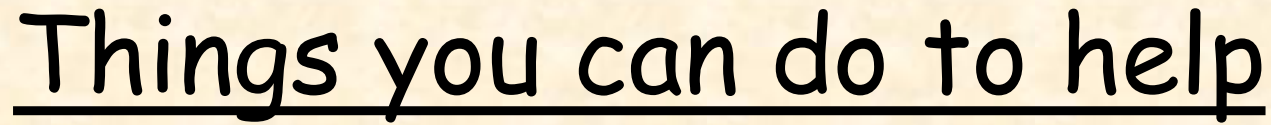


How can I help my child?

Reading	Writing
• Make reading an adventure - get them to act out scenes from books they've read. • Encourage a love of books through having a mini-library at home.. • Ask them for reviews of books that they've read and enjoyed.	• Encourage critical thinking through writing, such as in debates and from different perspectives. • Focus on the style of writing. Consideration to altering sentence types and using different literary devices. • Develop editing and polishing skills.
Mathematics	
• Develop their times table recall by using apps and games and visual aids. • Involve your child with practical problem solving, such as money, time or measure. • Use games to broaden their knowledge and encourage fun within maths.
