You will need:

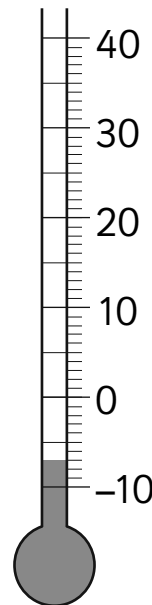
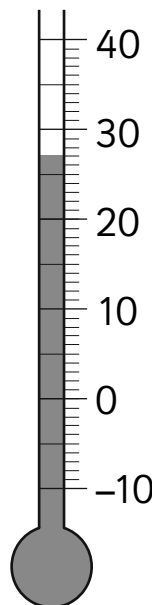
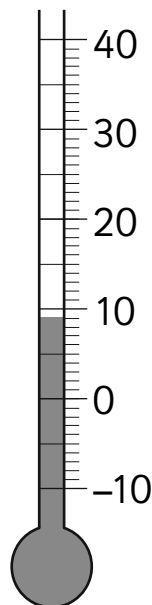
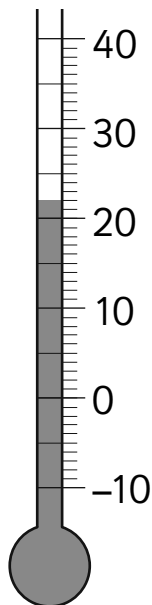
- scissors

What to do

Beth read the temperature on the classroom thermometer one morning. It was 13°C . She read it again in the afternoon. It had risen by 9 degrees.
