This week we will be learning about –
ck e u r.

“ck” is a digraph. A digraph is when 2 graphemes (letters) make 1 phoneme (sound). A digraph can usually be found at the middle or end of a word. The digraph “ck” will never be at the beginning of a word.

These are Set 4 of the Letters and Sounds programme.
