

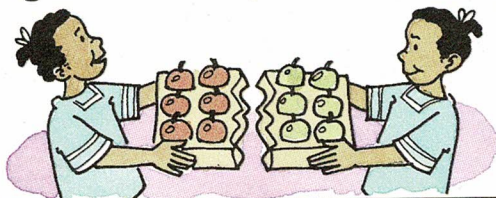


Each twin took half of the apples.

$$\frac{1}{2} \text{ of } 12 = 6$$

They made 2 equal shares.

$$12 \div 2 = 6$$



To find one half, divide by 2.

1 Find

(a) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 10

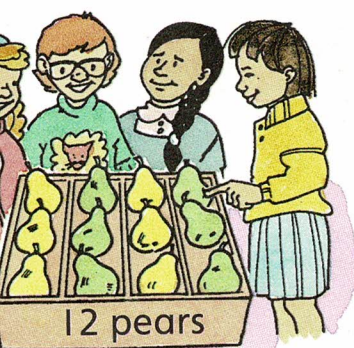
(b) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 8

(c) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6

(d) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 18

(e) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 2

(f) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 14



Four girls each took one quarter of the pears.

$$\frac{1}{4} \text{ of } 12 = 3$$

They made 4 equal shares.

$$12 \div 4 = 3$$

To find one quarter, divide by 4.

2 Find

(b) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 24

(c) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 28

(d) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 4

(e) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 40

(f) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 32

(a) $\frac{1}{2}$ of 16

(b) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 16

(c) $\frac{1}{4}$ of 36

4 There are 20 plums in a box.

One half of them are red and one quarter are yellow.

How many plums are

(a) red (b) yellow (c) not red or yellow?
