Spiritual Development in Modern Foreign Languages

- MFL encourages pupils to appreciate a range of cultures, beliefs, experiences and faiths.
- Pupils are taught to learn about themselves, others and the surrounding world.
- Pupils find out about the beliefs of people in different countries and use creative role play to bring language to life. They are encouraged to use their imagination and creativity to reflect on their experiences.

Moral Development in Modern Foreign Languages

- MFL gives pupils opportunities to explore moral issues through a range of listening, reading, writing and speaking activities.
- Pupils are encouraged to explore current affairs in different countries, recognising right from wrong and understanding the consequences.
- Pupils are given the opportunity and environment to debate and consider moral and ethical issues from around the world. They explore the ability to offer reasoned views.
- MFL encourages respect for others' cultures and languages. It promotes trust and fairness.

Social Development in Modern Foreign Languages

- Pupils begin to develop an understanding of their social and cultural environment, and an appreciation of the many cultures that now enrich our society.
- Pupils embrace culture and languages spoken in the local area. They participate in cultural awareness days and immerse themselves in the community.
- Pupils are taught to use new language to communicate with others. They are encouraged to work proactively and co-operatively in pairs and groups to support their social development.
- Pupils develop their understanding of similarities and differences in communities where a specific language is spoken. They appreciate diverse viewpoints.

Cultural Development in Modern Foreign Languages

- Pupils appreciate cultural influences and participate in cultural opportunities. They explore a range of artists, authors, musicians and historians from around the world.
